

Year End Parish Tithing Report

Each year, St. Raphael Parish tithes 5% of its weekly collection to community outreach and emergency assistance to individuals. Forty percent of this parish tithe is distributed by our Samaritan Ministry to non-profit organizations within our community; the remaining 60% is distributed through our St. Vincent DePaul Ministry to persons in need of emergency assistance (most often housing or utilities). St. Vincent DePaul is part of a larger national organization whose fiscal year runs October 1—September 30 of each year; its year end report will appear in our bulletin at the close of this fiscal year (early October). The St. Raphael fiscal year closes on June 30 of each year. The Samaritan Ministry Year End Report for '10-'11 appears below.
